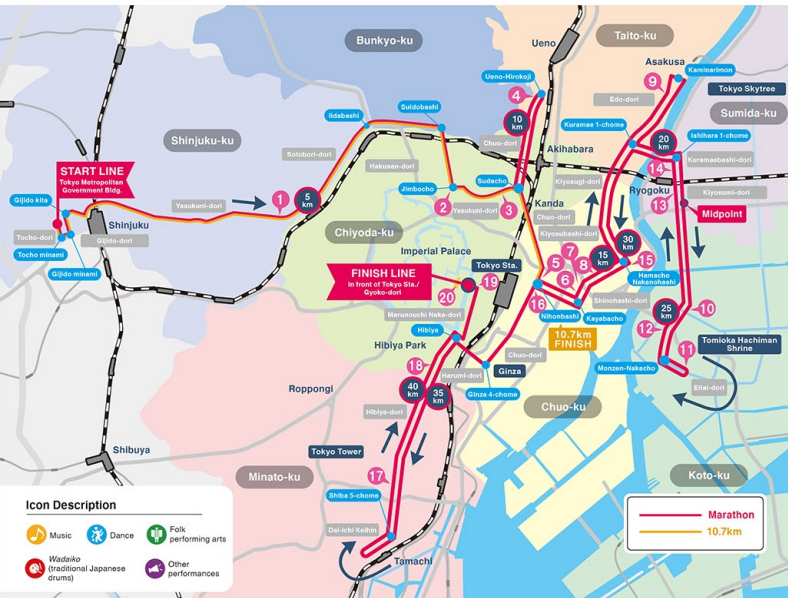

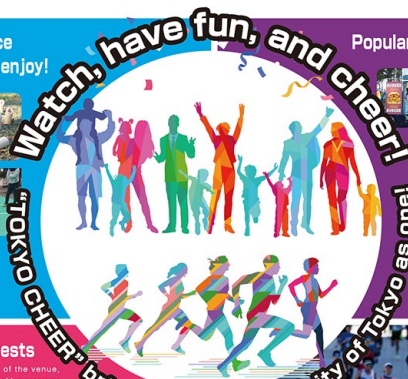

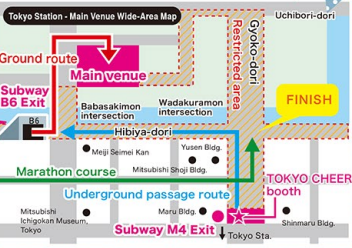

### Shooting Experience

Shooting will be featured as an event in the Tokyo 2025 Dealympics, which will be held this November, as well. In the air rifle and air pistol events, athletes aim at a target ten meters away.

You can have the rare opportunity to experience "shooting" with a bean gun.

### Boulderling Experience

Boulderling is a sport that can be enjoyed by a wide range of people regardless of age, gender or physical strength. With challenges prepared for beginners to advanced players, anyone can enjoy themselves regardless of their level.

### Boccia Experience

Boccia, which originated in Europe, is an official Paralympic event. It is a sport in which everyone can compete together regardless of their age, gender or disability. Try your hand at playing against various people at the venue!

### Molkky Experience

Molkky is a sport developed in 1996 based on the traditional game of *pelota* from Finland's Karelia region. In Finland where molkky has its origins, people play this casual sport while enjoying a sauna and beer. With its very simple rules, men and women of all ages can enjoy it.
